Consumer Health Complete provides convenient access to health and medical information that is easy to understand.

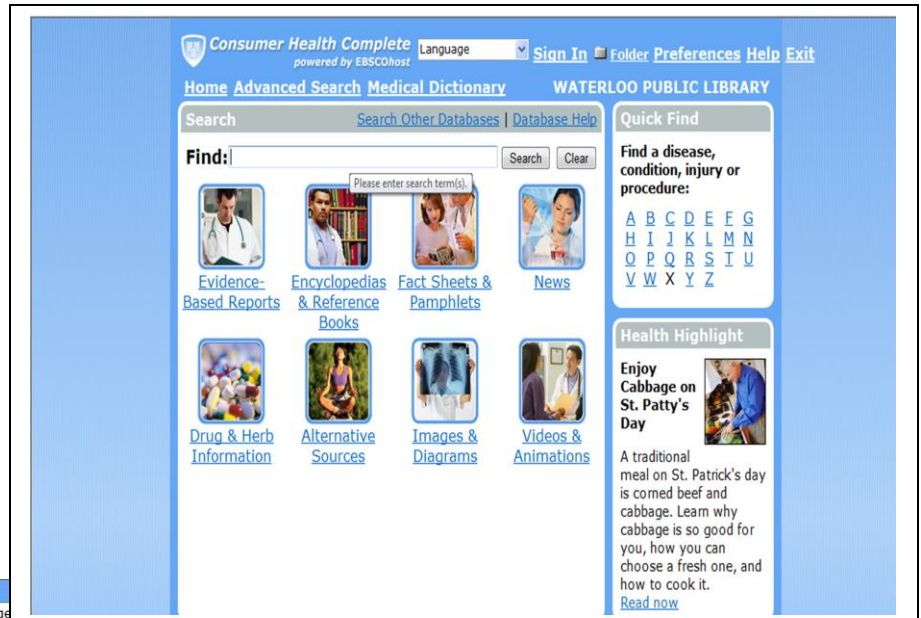
Where to find it?

How to use it

There are a number of ways for you to use this resource

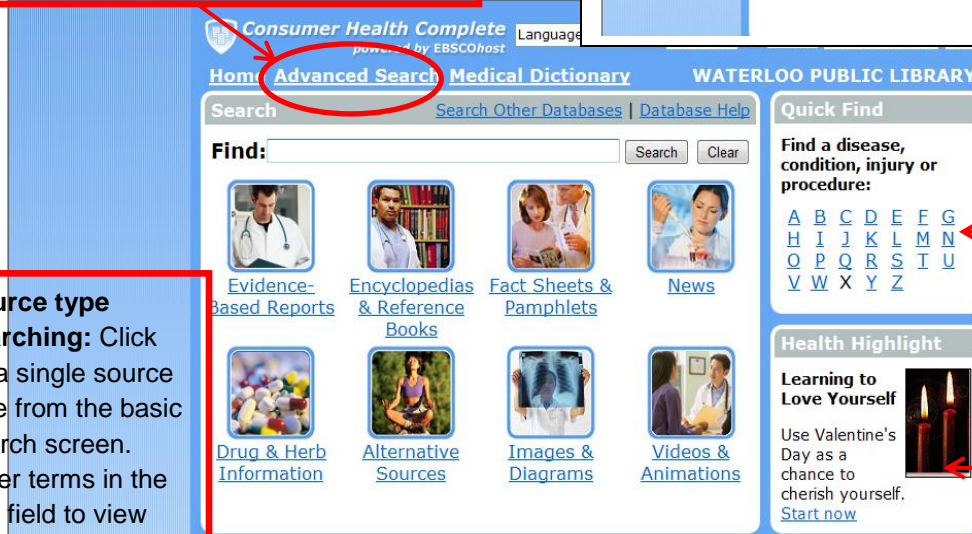
Advanced Search: From the Advanced Search screen you can limit your search to certain document types or apply search limiters to focus your results. You can also save your search history, set up search alerts or browse the list of publications represented in the database using the links shown along the top toolbar.



Source type searching: Click on a single source type from the basic search screen. Enter terms in the find field to view results from only that source.

Quick Find: provides access to information about diseases, conditions, injuries and procedures. Simply click on a letter to view a result list of links to pertinent reports.

Health Highlight: Check out the regularly updated Health Highlight for the latest popular medical information and tips.



Browse Popular Sources

Search by Topic

Browse Popular Sources: You can Browse Popular Sources by clicking on any of the book icons shown. When you have selected a source you may enter a term in the Browse for: field on which to search.

Search by Topic: You can search by topic by clicking on any of the links in this section. Select one or several subtopics from the resulting list, enter terms in the search field and click on the

After a search, the Results list includes a tab for each source type, which, when clicked, reveals only results from that source.
