

# What type of eReader should I buy?



## Are you planning on purchasing an eReader for yourself or someone else this holiday season?

There is a wide selection of eReaders available for sale. How do you know which eReader is right for you?

### Consider the following:

1. Screen type and size
  - E-ink or LCD display
  - Screen size
  - Colour or Black & White
  - Touchscreen or Manual
2. Format
  - Library eBooks are all in EPUB format
3. Wireless
  - Wireless or USB connectivity
4. Cost
  - A basic eReader is less than \$150 whereas an eReader with additional functionality will cost more

**\*\* If you intend to use your eReader mainly for downloading eBooks from the library, the Kobo eReader has proven to be both easy to use and troubleshoot any issues.**
