Obsession leads to desperation, and Frances discovers that people aren't always who they say they are. Fuller has created another slow burn, a twisty masterpiece that leaves the reader questioning how the story will end.

Books and libraries have been burned throughout time. Some have been burned intentionally while others suffered unhappy accidents. In 1986 the Los Angeles Public Library went up in flames destroying more than 400,000 books and damaging several hundreds of thousands more. Was it intentional, or an accident? This is the backdrop of Susan Orlean's love letter to libraries, history, and the power of the written word. Orlean's kinship with the LA library is effervescent.
