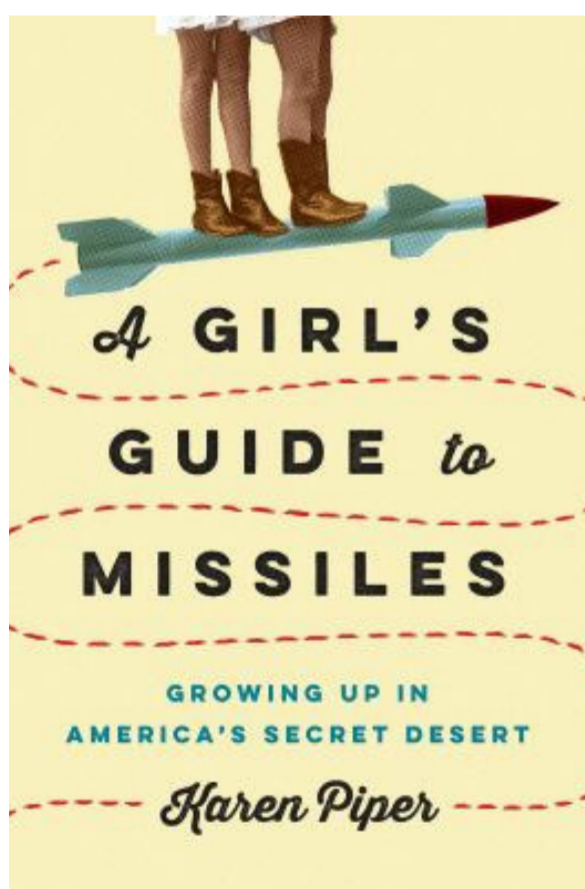
## Fiction
