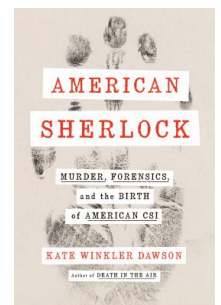
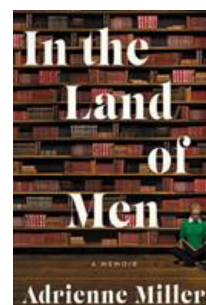
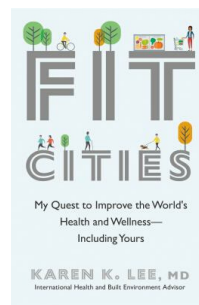
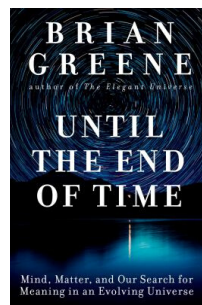
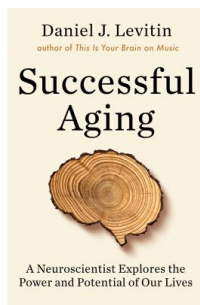
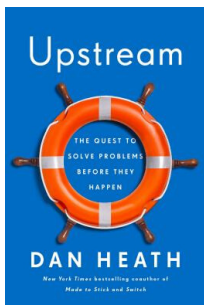
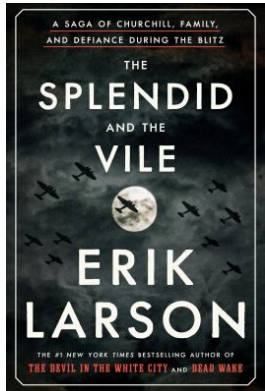


# Featured Titles

## Non-Fiction

Winston Churchill and WWII are well-covered territory on library shelves but this essential portrait of life during Britain's "darkest hour" is a splendid retelling of his daily activities combined with the wartime experience of his family in a single year (May 1940 - May 1941). Through diaries and archival material - some recently released - from officials in the U.S., Britain, and Germany, to his family and closest confidants we gain insight into Churchill's life and this pivotal year in world history. The intimate vignettes of those closest to him, such as his wife Clementine, his daughter Mary, his advisers, and his private secretary are blended perfectly with the tales of his relentless efforts to convince Roosevelt to join the fight while trying to keep Britain in one piece. Readers will be moved by this original and revealing account of a life we thought we knew so well.

But before filming can begin, a juror who claims to have new evidence that will prove Nock was guilty, is found dead in another juror's hotel room. "The Holdout" reads like a hard-boiled crime novel with the personal confessional of a reality tv show mixed in. Full of twists and turns, shocking reveals and 'I knew it' moments, the alternating character perspectives makes you question whether anyone can ever be truly innocent.
