Full-Time Summer Contract, 9 weeks, 35 hours/week

Summer Reading Club & Literacy Coach (7 positions available)

 - Maintain weekly contact with program participants through virtual meets, calls and letters.
 - Manage online portal for summer reading participation
 - Assist with other library-related work including processing materials, shelving and tidying.

- Assist WPL programming team to plan/deliver outdoor programming
- Engage/connect with community to support and promote Summer Reading Club and other initiatives.
 - Support Summer Reading Club initiatives including onboarding participants, preparing supplies/activities, pen pal program, etc.
- Assist at the branch(s) with programming/events and other library and circulation duties.

Summer Reading Club Coach & Connector (1 position available)

- Connect with families at Eastside Branch and community partners to promote Summer Reading Club and other children's initiatives
 - Support Summer Reading Club initiatives including onboarding participants, preparing supplies/activities, pen pal program, etc.
- Assist at the branch with programming/events and other library and circulation duties.

Qualifications include excellent communication skills, team-oriented, can-do attitude, passionate about spending time with kids and fostering their love for reading and learning.

Previous experience working with school-aged children.

Position will be paid \$15.00 per hour. Ability to work at any library location is required. Schedules are subject to change although will include day, evening and weekend shifts.
